#### Silence is kept for reflection.


- P Merciful God,







#### First Reading: Isaiah 51: 1-6



P Confident that God receives our joys and concerns, let us offer our prayers for the church, those in need, and all of creation.






#### Thanksgiving at the Table:




Gluten free wafers are available. Grape juice is located in the inner circle of the tray.

If you are unable to come to the altar and would like to receive communion, please tell an usher and communion will be brought to you.


For those who prefer to remain in the pew, individual communion sets containing grape juice are available in the narthex as people enter.
