MEN'S GROUP THURSDAY MORNING 8 AM — Every Thursday our men's group gathers for conversations around matters of faith. For the next 7 or 8 weeks we'll be using a **series of podcasts by Dr. David DeSteno entitled "How God Works"** to seed our discussion. As we enter into the new year, maybe you've been thinking about connecting with your faith more deeply. If so, why not take the leap and join us? Here's a description of the series:

While religion and science often seem at odds, there's one thing they can agree on: people who take part in spiritual practices tend to live longer, healthier, and happier lives. The big question is: Why? In the "How God Works" podcast, professor Dave DeSteno takes us on a journey to find out — one that combines cutting edge neuroscience with ancient wisdom.

He'll speak to leading scientists, spiritual teachers, and religious leaders to explore what we can learn from faith practices ranging from meditation and prayer to psychedelics and fire-walking. He'll look at how we can adapt and use spiritual practices in our own lives, whatever our beliefs — including none at all.

By working across boundaries that usually divide people — science versus religion, one faith versus another — we'll find new ways to make life better for everyone.

UPDATE on the HAVE A HEART FOR HOLY FAMILY Valentine Luncheon

On Saturday February 11th, Trinity hosted a Valentine-themed luncheon for Holy Family School after a covid hiatus of three years. As Marlene Bakle, the originator of the Holy Family luncheons 30 years ago, passed away last year, all donations were directed to the Marlene Bakle Memorial Scholarship Fund to honor her. Fellowship Hall was decorated beautifully with valentines, hearts and flowers and, in addition to the lovely lunch served, there was a lavish dessert buffet with a selection of desserts contributed by luncheon guests. Attendees included Trinity women, friends and family members and other North Shore women who are friends of Holy Family School. Over 70 women (and a couple of men) attended and \$23,000 was raised making it the largest fundraiser luncheon for Holy Family that Trinity has hosted in terms of attendees and donations. Holy Family Ministries CEO Cheryl Collins told the group in her talk that the current full cost per year of a Holy Family education is \$12,000 per student, a portion of which the student's family contributes. The difference is made up through funds from generous donors like the luncheon attendees.

A highlight of the luncheon was Holy Family 8th grader Rilee who spoke of some of the day-to-day realities of living on Chicago's West Side, her busy schedule and commitment to excellence as the future 8th grade valedictorian and a basketball team member. She also spoke of the Holy Family chapel lessons by Chaplain Leslie Hunter that have been so important in her personal development.

The luncheon was organized by committee members Stephanie Gabriele (Chair), Peg Lee, Rebecca Mestelle Paula Selvig, Joan Sherman, and Phyllis Treff from Trinity and Susan Crist and Cindi Rachowicz from St. John's in Wilmette. The group appreciated the set up and take down help from the Gabriele and Selvig men and Earl Rachowicz, and the dishwashing help from Sam Lewis.

LENTEN FOOD COLLECTION

For many years now, Trinity has collected food for the hungry during the season of Lent in a program we have called "40 items 40 days". Every year we have encouraged our members to consider taking part in a Lenten discipline of generosity and care for the vulnerable ones among us by filling bags with one item of non-perishable food for each of the 40 days of Lent. Those bags are then brought to Trinity, blessed, and sent on to local food pantries to care for those in need. This year, the need for food has only intensified because of inflation. If you would like to take part in a meaningful Lenten discipline that will make a real difference in the lives of people in need, this is something to consider.



We ask that you buy food as you are able, including 40 items if possible, and plan to bring them to church on Sunday, April 2, which is Palm Sunday. If you cannot come to church that day, it is possible to drop off food in the church narthex in advance of Palm Sunday. In addition to every Sunday morning and Lenten Wednesday evenings, the office will be open to receive your

donations during office hours: Monday- Thursday, 9:30 am to 5:00 pm. If you need a weekend drop-off time or a food pickup, please contact Carol Wilson, cnwedit52@gmail.com to make those arrangements. As always, items such as canned meats, pasta and pasta sauces, breakfast cereals, peanut butter and soup are appreciated. In addition, any items that can be consumed without using anything other than hot water, including ramen cups, tuna pouches, and granola bars is especially appropriate. This year the food will go to the Niles Township Food Pantry.
